

The most romantic story ever?

OUR first film after the holidays is *Cyrano de Bergerac*, and showcases Gerard Depardieu in a towering performance as the title character in this lavish adaptation of Edmond Rostand's stage drama. Film night is Tuesday 22 September; the deadline for booking your meal is Wednesday 16 September.

Based on the classic of French literature, Cyrano is the tale of a brave and noble soldier who needed a nose-job before they were available,

but he has the soul of a poet and uses his poetic gift to help a more visually appealing competitor gain the affections of his true love.

There are a few parts that certain actors were born to play, and this was Gerard Depardieu's. He is simply wonderful as the eloquent and dashing hero: passionate, larger than life, romantic and tragic in equal measure.

From the opening scene in which he takes on a theatre full of pretentious actors to the grand tear-jerking finale, Cyrano is always the centre of attention, and Depardieu, full of wit, bravado and passion, rises to the challenge.
