### Looking back over a busy year

CHAIRMAN Jill Whitechurch highlighted the delightful weekend that Launceston twinners enjoyed in Plestin as part of her review of the year's activities. "Fifty-five adults and 14 children had a lovely weekend over the early May bank holiday with the usual delightful hospitality," she said.

On this side of the Channel local twinners kept in touch with a series of social events to suit most interests. They included the regular French film-and-meal evenings, a wine and wisdom quiz night, Call My Bluff evening and a murder mystery. The association had also been involved in community events including a stall at the Victorian Market, a coffee morning at the Central Methodist Hall and the Remembrance Sunday service when Issie Thorns had laid the wreath on behalf of the association.

Jill said that although the official twinning exchanges were now alternate years, several twinners had kept up the tradition of annual exchanges and had hosted visits from their French twins as usual this year. She invited those who had done so to send photos and information to The Packet to show that those who wanted to keep up the annual exchanges were enthusiastically maintaining the momentum.

Treasurer Jean Mansell said the association had a larger-than-usual bank balance of £3,970 which reflected the fact that we did not entertain our Plestin twins in 2015. All the social events had made a surplus which stood us in good stead for hosting Plestin in 2016.

The most successful fund raising activities were the murder mystery and wine and wisdom evenings, but even the Victorian Market coffee and croissant stall had raised £37. Jean was presented with a pot plant as a thank-you for her hard work.



There was also a presentation for George and Patty Taylor who produce The Packet newsletter and are responsible for the association's website.

Secretary Jenny Birkett said that use of the website was steadily increasing. Over the year it had averaged about 90 visits a month (individuals logging on to the site) with an average of about 300 page views a month (the number of pages looked at). The record month was May – after the Plestin trip – when there were 114 visits and 470 page views. Sixteen issues of The Packet had been published so far in 2015.
