<u>Paignton Zoo:</u> With over 2,000 animals across 80 acres – visitors can get up close to some of the animal wonders of the world across specially designed habitats - from the savannah to the wetlands and the tropical forest. 
Cprès rous - Tuesday 1 March 2016

MAITRE d' Daniel Auteuil serves up a tasty comedy of love and fine dining, in a role for which he won a César (French Oscar equivalent) for Best Actor in 2005.

A random act of kindness snowballs into vivid proof that "no good deed goes unpunished" in this. Antoine (Auteuil), a restaurant headwaiter; takes a shortcut through a park one night and spots Louis (Jose Garcia), a despondent, lovelorn stranger, attempting to kill himself.

Antoine hustles him home to his apartment. And it isn't long before Antoine has decided to fix all that is wrong in Louis's life.
