### Job description for panellists


- 1. No previous experience necessary

'L'histoire d'Adèle H.' is a haunting film by François Truffaut about desire, devotion and madness, based on the real-life diaries of Adèle Hugo.

Oscar-nominated Isabelle Adjani stars in this lush portrait of a woman whose obsessive passion sets the stage for "one of the most romantic films of recent years".

Adèle, younger daughter of the French author and patriot Victor Hugo, is beautiful, composed and filled with the same brilliant writing talent as her famous father. However, Adèle is driven not by literary aspirations but by love. Impelled by a need that will not be denied, she has run away from home to follow her handsome, womanizing lover first across an ocean to wintry Halifax, Nova Scotia and then to hot and sunny Barbados. Wild with desire, she will risk everything to renew their brief affair to the point of losing her grasp on reality entirely.

### Visit from our Plestin twins

FOR those who would welcome an opportunity to discuss the plans for our exchange weekend with their Plestin twins, the committee has agreed outline plans for the two full days that our guests will be with us.

And with a huge contingent of more than 90 French visitors, an early indication of numbers for each activity will help organisers plan transport and advise venues\*. Our Plestin twins will arrive late on the evening of Friday (17 April) and be dropped off at Launceston College.

Saturday (18 April) will be our organised day out (more details below) with locations at venues within a comfortable drive from Launceston. Sunday will be a day with host families and our big welcome party in the evening at Trethorne Leisure Centre. Our visitors will return to France on Monday.

This year, we're really spoilt for choice of destinations with three suggested venues for our day out. Two are historic houses with extensive gardens and grounds and the third is an attraction that appeals to young people of all ages.

Coaches will be available for two venues and seats will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Twinners will be charged for their seats, but not our Plestin twins. Whichever destination is chosen, our twinning association will pay the entrance fees for all our French guests. All venues have restaurants/cafes or outside areas for picnics.

**Hidden Valley Discovery Park**, Tredidon, St Thomas, Launceston, Cornwall, PL15 8SJ (Twinners going to Hidden Valley to use their own transport.

Hidden Valley is full of puzzles, mystery, missions and secrets all waiting to be discovered. Discovery and exploration is the game, whether visitors choose the intriguing outside trails; the fast pace fun of Moriarty's Missions or simply to explore the park and discover an unfolding kaleidoscope of uniquely landscaped grounds.

The mysterious Forbidden Mansion hides weird and wonderful rooms, secret passageways and the challenging Moriarty's Missions. Visitors can take a train ride around the park on the Porterswick Junction Light Railway, with its bridges, cuttings and a snaking tunnel and, new this year, visit Tibbohton, an enchanting secret place, with little houses, paths, colourful gardens and some quirky goings on!

#### Trelissick, Feock, near Truro, TR3 6QL, Cornwall

(Twinning coach available for this trip)

This welcoming National Trust country house and garden is set in an estate with stunning maritime views and lovely woodland walks. Visitors can explore the meandering paths through the garden, woodland walks and open parkland with views down the estuary to the town of Falmouth.

The house has a friendly and inviting atmosphere with a rolling programme of exhibitions that reveal stories from its diverse history. It has its own renowned art gallery with a wide range of work from local Cornish artists. Crofters café offers a delicious range of light refreshments, hot lunches, afternoon cream teas and packed lunches for children, all using seasonal and local produce.

Killerton Estate in the heart of Devon boast a friendly Georgian house set in 2,600 hectare s (6,400 acres) of working farmland, woods, parkland, cottages and orchards. There's plenty of

calm space in the glorious garden, beautiful year-round with rhododendrons, magnolias, champion trees and formal lawns. Visitors can explore winding paths, climb an extinct volcano, discover an Iron Age hill fort and take in distant views towards Dartmoor.

Off the beaten track, it's possible to discover three of Killerton's hidden gems. Nestled by the River Clyst sits Clyston Mill, a working watermill. In the heart of Broadclyst there's the Marker's, a medieval house steeped in history, and just a stone's throw away from Killerton House is a 1950's post office with charming cottage garden.

#### Win Gilson

IT IS with regret that we record the death of Win Gilson – a keen and lively member of the Tuesday morning French groups.



Several twinners were among the packed congregation at Glynn Valley Crematorium to celebrate Win's life on 24 January.

They heard the story – told by her family – of a remarkable, groundbreaking woman who, in the sixties, had been the only female in her class for aeronautical engineering at Farnborough and who later went on to teach maths to black children in America.

Back in this country, she taught maths to young offenders and also in prison where, according to husband David, she had no problem keeping discipline!

Animals, and their welfare, played a big part in Win's life – from horses and sheep to pets and wild birds.

We send our condolences to her husband and their children and grandchildren.
