# Latest on our 2014 exchange visits

#### Launceston 2-5 May

A programme featuring a good mix of activities and free time has been devised for the long weekend of May 2-5 when we start celebrations to mark 30 years of twinning by entertaining our friends from Plestin.

They will arrive on the evening of Friday, 2 May, and the official events will start on Saturday morning with a sherry reception at Lawrence House Museum hosted by Launceston Mayor, Councillor Dave Gordon. The remainder of the day will be free - with an optional picnic in the castle park for families with children.

A visit to the Green Man Festival at Mount Edgcumbe is planned for Sunday. This will include falconry displays, archery, willow weaving, wood turning, fun around the village stocks and a craft fair and food market. And, if country fairs don't take your fancy, there is the magnificent house and country park to visit... On Sunday evening we will have a celebration party in the Town Hall with the band *Choughed to Bits* returning by popular request.

The visit will end with a Cornish Cream Tea on Monday afternoon at the home of Gill Grigg and Chris Skipp in Tavistock Road, Launceston. Then our French friends will leave to catch the overnight ferry.

Details of timings, meeting points, travel/parking arrangements, costs, and any booking forms will be published in The Packet closer to the time of the visit.

#### Plestin 19-22 September

We will take the overnight ferry on Friday, 19 September, and return on the morning ferry (arriving in Plymouth at 1500) on Monday, 22 September.

## French film night is 4 March
