The plot is as whimsical as its heroine, but the real delight is the army of oddballs that rotate around her.

Hypochondriac tobacconists, tyrannical grocers, kindly strippers, failed writers, and a garden gnome who suffers chronic wanderlust: all human (and some garden) life is to be found in this romantic comic fantasy from director Jean-Pierre Jeunet.
