Plestin painting unveiled in town's 'French Quarter'



Exactly 30 years ago to the day that Launceston signed its twinning charter with Plestin-les-Greves – 6 October – a specially-commissioned painting of Plestin was formally unveiled by the Mayor, Coun Dave Gordon, at the Town Hall.

The painting has been placed in an area of the Town Hall that already houses other souvenirs of the special relationship between the two towns, which led the Mayor to dub the area: "The French Quarter".

Coun Gordon congratulated the twin towns on reaching their 'pearl anniversary' and alluded to the fact that there were

Chairman of the twinners, Jill Whitechurch said 2014 had been an enjoyable and busy year and she gave a special thank you to the Mayor who had given the association such strong personal support for the anniversary celebrations.
