Although her salt-of-the-earth father has decided to run for mayor - spurred on by her mother - Paula's thoughts are increasingly elsewhere. She's witnessed the handsome new boy at school sign up for the choir, and impulsively joined too. It's not long before

There are a whopping 55 aquariums and 1,000 species to see. Highlights include the shark tank, a giant wall of coral and the topical greenhouse.



There are lots of opportunities for hands-on experience of sea creatures and close encounters, and outdoors, visitors can discover the otter path.
