A second summer walk is planned

EVERYONE enjoyed the July walk so much that it was unanimously agreed that we should do another Dartmoor walk this summer. The date has been set – Friday, 18 August, and the walk will take us to the area above Okehampton Camp.

This will provide a pleasant drive up on the moor for those who don't want to walk too far, with traffic-free roads for those who prefer a stroll while the fitter ones will be able to climb up on to the moor. Everyone is welcome and we'll meet at 6pm beyond the camp.

Finding the camp is easy. In the centre of Okehampton take the George Street and Station Road turn at the traffic lights. Instead of branching off to Okehampton Station, continue all the way up to the moor on Tors Road which turns into Camp Road.

After the camp go over bridge, don't turn right but go up hill and continue up the road until there is an area on the right of the road for parking, just before a right road which is blocked for traffic. If wet, walk will be off. There is a network of mostly unpaved roads where you can walk safely and easily all the way to the end of the roads into some of Dartmoor's most remote territory.

As the light will be fading at the end of the walk, it is suggested that we all go off to a pub afterwards instead of taking a picnic. *Please let Jenny Worth know if you're planning to join the walk – so that nobody gets left behind! Jenny can be contacted at: jaw53@hotmail.com*
