

An absorbing and provocative film

IN LOUIS MALLE's lauded war drama, Lucien Lacombe (Pierre Blaise) is a young man living in south-west rural France during World War II who seeks to join the French Resistance.

When he is rejected due to his youth, the resentful Lucien allies himself with the Nazis and joins the Gallic arm of their Gestapo.

Lucien grows to enjoy the power that comes with his position, but his life is complicated when he falls for France Horn (Aurore Clément), a beautiful young Jewish woman.

Oscar nominated, it is regarded by many critics as LOUIS MALLE's most ambitious and provocative film.
