# News round-up from our Annual General Meeting

ENTHUSIASM for the regular twinning exchanges between Launceston and Plestin shows no sign of diminishing and 82 twinners will make the journey from Launceston to Plestin in April next year.

Chairman Jill Whitechurch told the AGM on 16 November that changing the visits to alternate years had actually seen an increase in participants. "I looked back a few years and I noticed that 69 Launceston twinners went to Plestin in 2014," she said.

And we had entertained a record number of French visitors this year; so many, in fact, that some of the plans had to be changed to accommodate everyone.

Currently Launceston Twinning Association has 98 adult members and 26 children.

Jill said that not all twinning associations were as vibrant as ours and highlighted the encouraging participation by families in twinning activities – on both sides of the Channel – as a major contribution to our success.

"I feel the time has come for someone from the younger generation to push the twinning forward," she said. "I would like this to be my last year in the chair." She said she had thoroughly enjoyed her time as chairman but with more and more families joining she asked for people to put their names forward to take on the role as chairman next year.

Treasurer Jean Mansell reported that the association had a balance of £2,655 at the end of September. It was less than at the same time last year, but Jean explained that was because the deposit for the ferry had been paid. When she compared the balance with 2016 (the last time we went to Plestin) the balance then had been £2,017.

Jean said the healthy figure this year was due to the well-supported social and fund-raising activities during the year.

### <u>Our visit to Plestin</u> What to do on the first day?

"BECAUSE we arrive at 8am on FRIDAY and many of our families might be working, it could be more convenient if we did not arrive in Plestin until later in the day," said visit-organiser Jenny Worth.

"So we could go on a day trip on the Friday if hosts are busy during the day.

"If people do want to go off for the day, the committee would really like some ideas of what you would like."

Jenny said that 72 twinners would be travelling by coach to Plestin in April and ten would be making their own way.

Two coaches had been booked – a 37 seater and a 41 seater – and it was hoped to have one as the 'family coach.' All people who had requested special cabins had been successful.

THESE were among the suggestions for social and fund-raising activities over the coming year. The idea of a race night was warmly received by the audience at the AGM as was the suggestion of a pancake day event

Other suggestions included a French film in the afternoon for children, a version of the TV show *Would I Lie to You?*, a bingo evening, a 50-50 competition instead of a raffle and more walks.

It was agreed that the games evening with the beetle drive was a big success as was the safari supper, murder mystery and Cornish bake-off.

If the association continued to hold raffles, it was felt that 'decent' prizes should be offered and Alan Atkin, one of the bake-off judges, suggested that perhaps the rules could be reviewed so that a budget was set for the dishes or that competitors use English ingredients. He also asked the committee to consider asking people to submit individual dishes (rather than teams each submitting a three-course meal) because several individual dishes had been excellent but could not be singled out.

The suggestions will be considered by the committee in January when it plans next year's programme.
